Since 1990, Dr. Rosenthal has been the Director and Chief Executive Officer of Harvard University Health Service, coordinating the care and management of 35,000 members of the Harvard University community, in a group practice, financed through prepayment.

Closing Remarks

Katherine (Kasia) Clark, M.D. practices medicine with Harvard Medical Faculty Physicians, Affiliated Physicians Group. She was diagnosed with advanced ovarian cancer in 2000 while she was a family physician in upstate New York. Along with the radical treatments, Kasia challenged herself with a strict nutritional regimen, extreme athletics, and intensive violin studies and began documenting her ovarian cancer journey in film. In 2002, she joined with film professionals to create “Choosing Your Life: An Ovarian Cancer Journey” -- a one hour pilot film in a projected series dealing with various aspects of life after a cancer diagnosis.

Ursula A. Matulonis, M.D. has been an attending physician at both DFCI and Brigham and Women’s Hospital since 1995. She is an Assistant Professor of Medicine at Harvard Medical School, focusing her research on gynecologic malignancies. She is the Principal Investigator of several clinical trials as well as translational studies in ovarian cancer. Dr. Matulonis currently serves on the National Comprehensive Cancer Network Ovarian Cancer Recommendation and Guideline Committee, the Gynecologic Oncology Group Quality of Life Committee as well as Rare Tumor Committee. She is a recipient of the Dennis Thompson Compassionate Care Scholar Award.

Kenneth Miller, M.D. joined Dana-Farber Cancer Institute in 2008 and is a nationally known expert in issues facing cancer survivors. Dr. Miller has over 20 years of experiences as a breast oncologist and is also a member of the Breast Oncology Center at DFCI. His focus is on developing the adult survivorship program and integrating survivorship research and clinical care into the disease centers. He is also committed to research that helps reduce side effects of treatment and improve ongoing quality of life. Dr. Miller is the author of “Choices in Breast Cancer” (2008), and “Medical and Psychosocial Care of the Cancer Survivor” (2009). 3
